Little wonder, then, that, sometimes, we all need some support or advice from others.



Building on the success of our Messy Church which has been meeting now on a Saturday afternoon once a month we have recognised that we have the opportunity to develop this family ministry further.

From January our Messy Church will be part of a Messy Weekend which will see our 11am Sunday congregation join in with the families already gathering for Messy Church. The intention is to build friendships between age groups and see the church flourish across all age groups.

Crafts and activities for families will continue as normal run by the dedicated Messy Church team whilst at the same time we hope to see some new adult craft activity start up with seminars and prayer sessions running simultaneously for the "non-crafty" adults!

We will join together for family friendly worship to conclude and them move into the hall for a shared meal together which, we hope, will enable new friendships to be built in a time of shared fellowship and fun over dinner.

The Sundays of a Messy Weekend will still have a 9:30 service as well as our Sunday evening intimate worship gathering at 18:00 but there is no 11am service. It is very much our hope that all who would normally attend the 11am service on a Sunday will now switch to the Saturday afternoon that week and engage in this essential missional opportunity.

Priorities for 2024

At our recent PCC vision morning we spent time reflecting upon the challenges we face as a world, a nation and as a community. Our shared life will be shaped around the priority of seeing us grow together as disciples of Jesus having our lives and lifestyles transformed into his likeness.

Prayer

Underpinning all that we do will be our shared relationship with God through and in Jesus empowered by the Holy Spirit. This is the essence of prayer. Our being drawn into unity with God through our engagement with him in prayer. We will seek to deepen our shared and individual prayer life through this year.

Communication
